

What is the Bpi?

The Bibliothèque publique d'information is a public institution governed by the French Ministry of Culture, located in the Pompidou Centre. Since its opening in 1977, it is an encyclopaedic and information library providing the public with print, audio, audiovisual and digital collections.

It is open to all without any formalities, free of charge, for onsite use of materials only (no loans).

The Bpi provides the following

onsite...

- 350,000 books
- 2,500 magazine, newspaper, and periodical titles
- 7,000 maps
- scanned newspaper articles
- 2,000 sheet music scores
- 13,000 compact discs
- 2,000 audio files
- 2,250 documentary films
- 250 animation films
- 550 films produced by Arte (Arte Vod)
- 1,200 tutorials, software, and websites for self-teaching
- 1,500 learning materials or open-shelf books for 220 languages
- 11 television channels
- 2,000 electronic documents
- 2 pianos
- sound archives (debates, conferences, etc. organised by the Bpi)

Multimedia computers

Free access to Bpi content:

- the Bpi subscribes to over 2,000 databases (different accesses according to the area you are consulting from)
- films
- recordings of Bpi events
- music and sound recordings (in the Music areas)
- Press (in the Press area)
- Self Teaching websites (in the Self Teaching area).

Internet computers

40 minutes of free access to the web: request your ticket from the General Information Desk (level 1).

Press (level 2)

Self Teaching (level 2)

- learn 220 languages and dialects
- learn with 400 tutorials and educational software:

office, DTP, highway code, accounting, technology, etc.

• participate in conversation or IT workshops, etc.



Music and audio files

(level 3)

- listen to music, audio files, watch musicals, consult electronic resources on music, etc.
- books, sheet music, magazines, sound recordings (CDs, cassettes), audiovisual (DVD, filmed concerts and documentaries), electronic resources, etc.





Films


2,500 films (documentaries, animation, shows) can be viewed on multimedia computers or in area 7.



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Job Search, Professional and School Guidance, Day-to-day Life, Graphic Collections and Video Games Distribution of Internet tickets








